


Letter From Our Executive Director

In retirement, Mark maintains an active social life through his involvement in several clubs with his friends. His background in engineering made Mark a natural fit to be the groups' main organizer and planner. When he had a stroke of the optic nerve in both his eyes, Mark wasn't sure he would be able to continue to bring people together.

Mark started looking for solutions and found BCABVI. Emily, one of our Certified Low Vision Specialists, took the time to understand Mark's unique situation and identified accessible technology options that would work for him. She taught Mark to navigate screen reader programs including VoiceOver for the iPad, Windows Narrator for emails, and ZoomText for Excel. He learned to use Alexa to manage calendar appointments. By using these assistive technology tools, Mark can still do the things that are meaningful to him.

Mary values her independence. When a stroke left her with worsening eyesight, she didn't know what to do or where to turn. Living alone without any family nearby, Mary worried that she wouldn't be able to stay in her home. A close friend saw her daily struggles and called BCABVI.

We listened to Mary's concerns and helped identify what supports she needed to remain in her home. Deb, our Case Aide, works with Mary to pay her bills and complete paperwork. She makes sure Mary always has food in her house by preparing shopping lists and arranging trips to the grocery store with our drivers. Deb also helps Mary stay on top of her healthcare by scheduling her doctor appointments and coordinating our drivers so she can get there safely and on time.

"With Deb I feel a lot more independent. She has made things much easier for me. I couldn't live independently without her help." - Mary F.

Mary is confident that she can live independently knowing that she has Deb for support. Now she's able to focus her attention on the things that bring her joy.

Bucks County Intermediate Unit

BCIU is a K-12 education service agency that supports the needs of students, their families, and school districts in our area. The goal of BCABVI's preschool screening program is to identify and access treatment for undiagnosed vision problems in young children. Both organizations share the goal of encouraging student success.

Working together, we were able to reach a more diverse population of students from across Bucks County. Our joint efforts resulted in **22% of participating preschoolers** at BCIU sponsored sites being recommended for a follow-up visit with an eye care professional.

Salus University's William Feinbloom Vision Rehabilitation Center and BCABVI's Low Vision Clinic share a common goal of providing the highest quality of clinical services for people with visual impairments.

Salus helped us see more patients at our Low Vision Clinic by bringing their mobile clinic to our Newtown facility. We developed an internship program for Salus University students, offering them practical experience in rehabilitation services. BCABVI employs several Salus graduates who contribute their expertise to our team.

Through our partnership, we're able to provide our community with greater access to quality low vision services.

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
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2022-2023 Finances

Looking Ahead to the Future

For 2023-2024, BCABVI has targeted three key areas to help our clients thrive:

1) Low Vision Clinic Services

Last year's successful expansion of our clinic increased the availability of low vision evaluations and rehabilitation training. This growth created more awareness of, and demand for, these specialized services within our community. We are exploring sustainable, cost effective models to increase our service capacity.

2) Mental Health Services

Each person adjusts to vision loss differently. Anxiety, depression and stress are common among people with visual impairments. We are developing partnerships with mental health professionals to offer services to help with the adjustment process.

3) Communications

A revised communication plan allowed us to more effectively engage current supporters and encourage new relationships. Our investment in new technology will allow us to reach more people by offering varied and customized communications. A new website in 2024 will help increase awareness of our services and provide a better forum to share our impact with our community.

Our Mission is to provide resources, answers and support for people with blindness or other visual impairment that maximize their ability to meet life's daily challenges and realize their continued self-worth and value to our community.
